Expressed hope that new skill lab will help in development of Psychomotor skills of our students.

Stressed that the curriculum regrading sub specialties like Neuro Surgery, Urology and Plastic Surgery should be revisited with need of graduating students. He stated that for example Organ Transplantation; scope has tremendously increased during last decade and is being practice in many centers of the world.

Prof Syed Razi Muhammad

Agreeing importance of organ transplant, however mentioned that in present semester system practically we faced difficulty in completing important and common topic and therefore it is very hard to be delivered detailed account of organ transplant. However, in addition to basic principles we should emphasized about ethical and Islamic aspect of organ transplant.

Prof Shahida Memon

Consented to write about the ethical and Islamic aspect of organ transplant in general.

Prof Rashida Qasim

Pointed out about the ECG taking reading is essential component of Cardiology, therefore the physiological principles relating to the ECG should be taught to M1 and M2 students.



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Prof Rayno

Pointed that presently we take help of 3D graphic and manikin to detailed gross anatomy and therefore unable to get done embalming by our students. Previously it was common practice to do embalming when dissection and teaching was done over dead body. Due to lack of fundamental concept of embalming even specimens from clinical specialists are not being embalmed. The overall results is that we are not in a position to maintain/developed museum.

Prof Aijaz A Memon

Likeminded with the view of Prof Rayno and suggest that at least young doctors should come forward so that we can maintained/developed our museum.

Prof Rayno

As students are not familiar with embalming and consequently take no interest during their house job.

Prof Syed Razi Muhammad

Suggested that a clinical demonstration/short group discussion may be added to the existing lecture of Anatomy so that every student get a chance to know the basic principles of embalming.

Prof Rayno

Responded positively to the proposal.
